The Projected Nation: Argentine Cinema and the Social Margins (SUNY Press, 2018)

Before Bemberg: Women Directors in Argentine Film (Rutgers University Press, 2020): It is widely known that a longstanding gendered division of labor under which very few women directed films was partly neutralized by, after 1980, the success of María Luisa Bemberg's feature films, and, since the 1990s, the emergence of dozens of women filmmakers. In order to expand discussions of gender and Argentine cinema, this book examines women in film production and direction from the silent period until the present and closely examines the films made by the few women who directed before 1980, all of which have suffered critical neglect.

Commercial Cinema's Responses to Militant Film: The Depoliticization of the Social Margins: This project puts the politicized New Cinema in dialog with a seldom-examined contemporary, the commercial narrative cinema of the 1960s and '70s. Where the former represented the social margins critically, the latter responds to the undeniability of the existence of these spaces by representing them through various strategies that tend to render them politically inert. An article is forthcoming in the Journal of Latin American Cultural Studies that is part of this project and another has been submitted to Modern Language Notes.
